The Boy Scouts of America, was incorporated on February 8th, 1910, under the laws of the District of Columbia, by W. D. Boyce. On June 21st, 34 national representatives from boy organizations met to establish the Boy Scouts of America.

This exhibit of the centennial celebration begins with a presentation of special scout postage developed by and for the Boy Scouts of America. We continue with the first celebration event that took place on July 4th, 2009, in Pawhuska, Oklahoma. We will follow the celebration across America through the more than 90 known pictorial cancellations shown on event covers. You will see the unveiling of the new Boy Scout stamp, November 12, 2009, in Washington D. C., the First Day Ceremony at the National Jamboree at Fort A. P. Hill, Virginia, July 27th, 2010, and the continuation of events to the end of December 2010.








Background:

With this stamp, the U.S. Postal Service celebrates the adventure and spirit of scouting. Since the creation of the international youth scouting movement some 100 years ago, hundreds of millions of children have benefited from opportunities for adventure, skill building, leadership, personal development, and community service provided by scouting organizations. To create this original stamp design, illustrator Craig Frazier of Mill Valley, Calif., depicted the images of two different scouts in clothing and accessories that are often part of the outdoor scouting experience – hats, packs, boots and binoculars.

'Celebrate Scouting' Stamp Unveiled

National Letter Writing Campaign Launched to Support Our Troops

WASHINGTON — The U.S. Postal Service today gave scouting 'a stamp of approval' to honor 100 years of the U.S. scouting movement. The *Celebrate Scouting* stamp, which will be sold in the summer of 2010, coincides with the Boy Scouts of America's 100th anniversary.

The new stamp design was unveiled Thursday during an event at the Smithsonian National Postal Museum. The design, created by illustrator Craig Frazier of Mill Valley, CA, depicts the spirit and outdoor adventure of scouting through a backpacking scout and a large silhouette of a scout surveying the landscape.

Since the creation of the international youth scouting movement some 100 years ago, hundreds of millions of children have benefited from opportunities for adventure, skill building, leadership, personal development, and community service provided by scouting organizations.

"I'm very proud to represent the United States Postal Service as we unveil the artwork for the scouting commemorative stamp to be released in 2010 and to recognize what scouting has done for boys and girls alike for more than 100 years," said USPS Sustainability Vice President, Samuel M. Pulcrano. "I learned a great many things from scouting when I was a boy, and many of those lessons came from my father who served as my assistant scoutmaster. The experience made such an impression on me that I now serve as assistant scoutmaster for my sons' troop."

Joining Pulcrano at the unveiling event were Allen Kane, Director of Smithsonian National Postal Museum; Jim Terry, Boy Scouts of America Assistant Chief Scout Executive; Bob Mersereau, Boy Scouts of America National Director of the 100th Anniversary; Kevin Coleman, Manager, Information Policies and

Procedures, USPS; Sen. Dick Lugar, R-IN; and Ernest Green, member of 1957 Little Rock Nine, who helped integrate the nation's public school system, and Honorary Chairman of the Boy Scouts of America National Hall of Leadership. Green was one of nine African-American students who, in 1957, were the first black students ever to attend classes at Little Rock Central High School in Little Rock, AR. He was the first black to graduate from the school.

The Postal Service appreciates the efforts of a number of individuals, including Rep. Pete Sessions, R-TX, Sen. Dick Lugar, R-IN, Rep. Ike Skelton, D-MO., and Sen. Ben Nelson, D-Neb., in working toward creation of the *Celebrate Scouting* stamp and their leadership on scouting.

In conjunction with the Celebrate Scouting announcement and Veteran's Day observances, the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) announced it will begin a nationwide effort to support U.S. Armed Forces personnel serving overseas and veterans by sending letters and care packages using the Priority Mail Flat Rate Box through the Postal Service. Local DC-area scouts mailed letters and shared news about the scouting stamp from the museum this morning. The letter writing campaign continues the BSA's longstanding tradition of service and performing "a good turn" daily.

"We are grateful to the USPS for commemorating scouting's contributions to our nation for the past 100 years," said Bob Mazzuca, Chief Scout Executive, Boy Scouts of America. "To continue our tradition of service, we are honored to launch our letter writing campaign to support our troops serving overseas. Regardless of our age, we never outgrow the joy of receiving a personal letter in the mail. It is the least we can do for the service men and women to whom we owe the deepest gratitude for their service."

The new Celebrate Scouting stamps will go on sale nationwide and will be dedicated in July 2010 at the Boy Scout Jamboree at Ft. A.P. Hill, VA.

The Boy Scouts of America will celebrate its 100th anniversary on February 8, 2010. To mark this milestone, the organization has undertaken nationwide celebration efforts that reintroduce the organization to today's young people and families, reinforce the value of scouting, and reconnect with the millions the organization has impacted. 

ith this stamp, the U.S. Postal Service celebrates the adventure and spirit of scouting. Since the birth of the international youth scouting movement some 100 years ago, hundreds of millions of children have benefited from opportunities for adventure, skill building, leadership, personal development, and community service provided by scouting organizations. These groups offer young people communities in which they can learn collaboratively, glean wisdom from adult mentors, and strive to become better citizens in the process.


Historically, scouts had to find their way by the stars or a map, notice tracks and interpret their meaning, and fend for themselves in the wild. A century later, scouting's reverence for nature remains unchanged, but the movement has kept pace with a changing world. Scouting education has adapted to advances in science and technology and to new perspectives on environmental issues. Even as scouting has expanded to include a wide range of hobbies and useful skills-from stamp collecting to financial literacy-community involvement remains paramount.

Scouting organizations worldwide reflect their own national character. but their shared values are summed up in a letter that Lord Robert Baden-Powell left to be read by his scouts after his death. Baden-Powell is often credited as the founder of the scouting movement, and his words speak to the universality of the scouting experience. "Try and leave this world a little better than you found it," Baden-Powell wrote, "and when your turn comes to die, you can die happy in feeling that at any rate you have not wasted your time but have done your best.'

In this stamp design, illustrator Craig Frazier of Mill Valley, California evokes the spirit of the outdoor scouting experience. At first glance, one sees the large silhouette of a scout peering through binoculars. Then a second scout perched atop a mountain draws the viewer inward. "I wanted a level of discovery to be portrayed in the stamp itself," Frazier explains.



The stamps were delivered to the local post offices in packs of 100 panes sealed in clear cellophane. The top sheet in each pack was an information sheet on card stock. While the bottom of the pack was a piece of gray cardboard cut to size.



The panes were printed in sheets of 8 and then later cut apart. You will note that the plate Number can be found in all four corners of each pane.



The U.S. Postal Service celebrates the adventure and spirit of scouting with the issuance of this stamp designed by illustrator Craig Frazier.

Since the creation of the international youth scouting movement some 100 years ago, hundreds of millions of children have benefited from opportunities for adventure, skill building, leadership, personal development, and community service provided by scouting organizations. These groups offer young people communities in which they can learn collaboratively and have fun in partnership with adults.

Historically, scouts were trained to find their way using the stars or a map, to notice tracks and interpret their meaning, and essentially to fend for themselves outdoors. Many of today's youth scouts continue to learn these and other skills related to outdoor and indoor activities, and these youngsters often enjoy hobbies made accessible to them through scouting.

Boys and girls alike have been involved in the scouting movement from its earliest days; female scouts are often called guides. Today, coed scouting is the norm in many countries.

Frazier's stamp design is itself a discovery. Within a large silhouette of a scout raising binoculars to his eyes is another scout standing atop a mountain gazing out at the vista. Each of the scouts is shown in clothing and accessories that are often part of the outdoor scouting experience—hats, packs, boots, and binoculars. The illustrator recalls, "I wanted a level of discovery to be portrayed in the stamp itself."

He continues, "The small figure and landscape indicate very hard, directional light coming from low on the horizon—either early morning or late afternoon. The sky has that pale blue to indigo transition that happens only at those two times of day."

Frazier, whose designs for the Postal Service include the 2003 Nurturing Love stamped envelope and True Blue, the 2006 Love series stamp, works out of his studio in Mill Valley, California.
