Almost everyone knows that the rank of "Eagle Scout" is the highest award a Boy Scout may receive in scouting, but how many people realize what the Boy Scout has to do to receive this award.

This thematic exhibit will illustrate what is required of a First-Class Scout, in order to receive the award of "Eagle Scout".

After completing the requirements as a Tenderfoot Scout, Second-Class Scout, and First-Class Scout part of the requirements for advancing to the rank of "Eagle Scout" is by earning merit badges.

A Scout needs a total of 21 merit badges, 11 of which are mandatory and the balance elective badges. All mandatory including 3 optional ones and 111 elective badges are shown. There are over 100 different Countries in this exhibit.
