THEIR GROWTH BOTH NATIONALLY AND INTERNATIONLY ARE MOST INTRIGUING DURING THE PERIOD OF 1930'S THROUGH 1960'S. THE MANY DIFFERENT METHODS OF AIR TRANSPORTATION USED TO CARRY THE MAILS ARE WHAT DREAMS AND ROMANCES ARE MADE OF.

THIS IS ONLY A SAMPLE OF THE MANY AIRMAIL-SCOUT RELATED ITEMS THAT COULD BE COLLECTED. THIS FORMS A DIFFERENT TYPE OF SCOUTS ON STAMPS COLLECTION TO GO AFTER. THE ONLY LIMIT ON ONE'S COLLECTING, IS IMAGINATION.

The card was then forward to Germany for the flight between Friedrichshafen, Germany to Lausanne, Switzerland. The card has the on board cancel from Friedrichshafen dated August 20, 1931. It arrived in Lausanne on August 27, 1931. The card is print with a "Mit Zeppelin; L. Z. 127" in blue, a hand stamp cachet in red is also added to the front.




Flight cover from the Jamboree to Messenhauserg, Austria via Budapest posted on August 13, 1933. The cover has the special glider flight cachet.


The last cover for this flight was canceled at West Point, N. Y. by machine at 1PM on the day of the flight.







ALL INDIA JAMBOREE ROCKET MAIL 1937




The National Jamboree of India,1937 has the honor of having a early rocketeer, Stephen M. Smith, attend the Jamboree. There were a total of 12 large rockets prepared for the Jamboree, only 11 were fired for the other fell victim to ants. On Feb. 3, 1937 there were a total of 4 rockets fired; 2 for mail and the other 2 for messages of welcome. The above has been franked with the special green rocket label and canceled with the Rocket Despatch hand canceler as well as being franked with regular Indian postage and canceled with the special Jamboree hand canceler at the post office on site. This rocket #138, "Princess Elizabeth" carried 254 covers and 34 copies of the Jamboree Daily.

TRANS-PACIFIC VIA CHINA CLIPPER 1937



Commercially used cover franked with the twenty cent Transpacific Air Mail stamp of 1937 canceled at Hilo, Hawaii on May 4, 1937. The cover is from the Hawaii Island Girl Scouts and sent to Central Point, Oregon. This cover is correctly franked, this was very expenive for the average letter via surface mail was only three cents and this air mail service was almost seven times the cost. A limited number of letters would have been sent this way to the mainland for the United States was just coming out of the "Great Depression".

FIFTH WORLD JAMBOREE PRE - JAMBOREE FLIGHTS NETHERLAND TO DUTCH INDIES 1937



Netherlands to Dutch Indies using a Jamboree Stamp in in mixed franking. Left the Netherlands, June 6, arrived June 10, 1937. A special flight cachet was applied in purple.

Dutch Indies to the Netherlands franked with a Jamboree set of stamps. Canceled June 14, left Dutch Indies, June 16, arrived on June 21, 1937. A special World Jamboree envelope was used and a special cachet was applied in black for the flight.



AUSTRIA BALLON POST

The special Baloon Post envelope franked with the Seventh World Jamboree stamp. The cancel is for the ballon flight on the Ballon "Zurick" from Salzburg to Kuchl on October 21, 1951. The funds helped to build children's homes and camps.



THE 8th ISRAEL JAMBOUREE SPECIAL FLIGHT HAIFA TO LOD NEMAL TEUFA 1961





The special flight between Haifa and Lod Nemal Tefa on August 1, 1961 was flown by the air taxi service in a single engine light plane. The cover is registered and had the special Jambouree cancel and a printed cachet as well as the hand stamp flight cachet on the front. The back has the special Jambouree cancel, the regular Haifa post office cancel and a receiver cancel for Lod Nemal Teufa.

SWITZERLAND TWICE CARRIED COVER VIA AUTO POST AND BALLON

1968



First carried by the Autopost from the European Scout Conference on September 28, 1968 and then carried by ballon on October 12, 1968. The cards were made for the special ballon post but were used at the conference with the Autopost first. A special conference cachet was added to the card at this time. On both trips the Swiss scout stamp are part of the franking.

INTERNATIONAL SCOUT CAMP BLAIR ATHOLL, UNITED KINGDOM HELICOPTER POST

JULY 26, 1980



The card was posted and canceled with the special International Scout Camp, Blair Atholl, Pitlochry (Scotland) with a hand canceler on July 26, 1980. A special helicopter scout post private label (stamp) is added and canceled in blue on July 29, 1980 using a Scout Post canceler. There was an additional red and purple hand stamp applied, which stated the ground of the flight due to bad weather.
